Job Description

Position Summary:

Reporting to the Director of Operational Services, the Senior Manager, Operations, Roads & Traffic is responsible for the overall leadership, planning, and management of the Roads & Traffic division. This includes the daily operation and maintenance of urban and rural roads, bridges, traffic systems, signage, pavement markings, storm water management, and related infrastructure. The Senior Manager oversees the full lifecycle of municipal road projects, from planning through delivery, while ensuring compliance with legislative requirements, optimal asset management, and alignment with the Town's strategic and sustainability goals.

This role leads a multidisciplinary team of supervisory, technical, and unionized staff, fostering a culture of safety, collaboration, and innovation. Key priorities include strategic operational planning, asset and risk management, capital and operating budget administration, stakeholder engagement, and continuous service improvement. The Senior Manager plays a pivotal role in emergency response and incident management, representing the Town in public forums, inter-agency meetings, and during emergency operations.

Key Responsibilities:

Strategic Leadership & Team Oversight

- Provide direction, mentorship, and leadership to a diverse team of approximately 40 staff, including supervisors, technical specialists, and unionized employees.
- Lead workforce development, succession planning, performance management, and change initiatives to support continuous improvement.
- Foster a safety-first, professional, and innovative workplace culture.

Program Planning & Asset Management

- Develop and execute annual and multi-year plans for roads maintenance, traffic operations, and related infrastructure programs, aligned with the Town's transportation master plan and road safety strategies.
- Oversee asset lifecycle management, condition assessments, and risk mitigation to maximize service life and infrastructure reliability.
- Direct the delivery of capital projects from planning through completion, ensuring quality, budget, and schedule compliance.



Traffic Operations & Safety

- Provide executive oversight of traffic operations, including signals, traffic calming, signage, road closures, and detours.
- Ensure traffic and road operations support active transportation, Vision Zero principles, and community safety initiatives.
- Respond to traffic-related inquiries, incidents, and service requests with timely, data-driven solutions.

Service Delivery & Operational Excellence

- Establish and monitor service level agreements, KPIs, and SOPs for roads and traffic operations.
- Implement continuous improvement initiatives and technological innovations to enhance efficiency and service delivery.
- Ensure operational readiness and emergency response capacity during severe weather, infrastructure failures, and other critical events.

Financial & Contract Management

- Prepare and manage multi-million-dollar operating and capital budgets for Roads & Traffic services.
- Lead procurement, vendor oversight, and contract administration for infrastructure projects, maintenance services, and fleet/equipment management.
- Identify cost-saving measures and funding opportunities, including grants and intergovernmental partnerships.

Regulatory Compliance & Risk Management

- Ensure compliance with the Highway Traffic Act, Occupational Health & Safety Act, Environmental Protection Act, Minimum Maintenance Standards, and relevant municipal bylaws.
- Lead risk assessments, safety audits, and incident investigations, implementing corrective measures and maintaining legal defensibility.
- Represent the Town in litigation, insurance claims, and inter-agency investigations as required.

Stakeholder & Council Engagement

- Serve as a senior liaison to Council, residents, contractors, utilities, regional partners, and agencies (e.g., MTO, Metrolinx).
- Prepare and present high-level reports, strategic recommendations, and policy updates to Council and senior leadership.
- Collaborate across departments to support integrated municipal service delivery.

- Skilled in budget management, procurement, vendor oversight, and risk mitigation.
